LARGE INCOMES IN ENGLAND. — There are forty-six persons in England who have incomes of £450,000 a year, equal to two millions and a quarter dollars, while four hundred and forty-four persons have incomes ranging from fifty to two hundred and fifty thousand dollars a year, and eight hundred and eleven from twenty-five to fifty thousand. In Ireland there is but one person who has an income of upward of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars; twenty-one have incomes from fifty thousand to two hundred and fifty thousand, and thirty from twenty-five to fifty thousand.

NEW CANAL BOAT. — The Buffalo Commercial says Van Slyke & Notter are building for E. S. Prosser a full size steam canal boat. She is to have two decks, and will be when completed, 15 feet from the bottom of the boat to the top of the deck, and will have capacity for 2000 barrels of flour.

CREOSOTE FOR WARTS. — Dr. Rainey of St. Thomas' hospital, London, has furnished a communication to *The Lancet*, detailing the effects of creosote applied to warts. He applied it, among other instances, to an obstinate warty excrecence on the finger, and then covered it over with a piece of sticking plaster. This course he pursued every three days for two weeks, when, on examination, the wart was found to have disappeared, leaving the part beneath it quite healthy.
