WILL REED.

What the Sullivan Democrat Has to Say of the Absconding Express Agent.

The most surprising instance of human frailty that has failed under our observation for a long time, is shown in the disappearance of Will Reed, of the firm of Reed, Dean, dealers in queen-size, and Adams Express agent at this place. He left town on the 9 o'clock express train, Friday night, without notifying any of his friends of his intention.

It seems that his business venture in the queen-size trade was not a success, and it was evident to the first that they could not meet their masters' demands, and that an assignment for the benefit of their creditors was inevitable. In the midst of this financial trouble he left, riding in the express car in company with Mr. Geo. It has subsequently appeared that on the evening before he left, the First National Bank deposited in the express office a package containing twenty-five hundred dollars, for transmission to a Cincinnati bank. Not receiving any acknowledgment, the bank instituted inquiries, when it appeared there was no entry on the books of the pack-gg. Reed is supposed to have taken the money. His bondsmen are R. M. Griffith, David Crowley and Dr. Crowder. We learn that his mother has voluntarily secured them against loss.

Up to the time of his disappearance no young man stood higher in the estimation of the community generally than Will Reed. We are exceedingly reluctant to believe in his guilt, yet his conduct and the circumstances seem to render it a foregone conclusion.
