## Leesburg Pastor Is Victim Of Own Hand

Rev. Clark W. Myers, 64, of Leesburg, pastor of the Leesburg and Clunette Methodist churches, died at his home of a gunshot wound to the head about 7:30 a.m. Monday. Kosciusko county coroner Dr. Joe Bill Misher reportedly ruled the death a suicide and stated the wound was self-inflicted by a .22 caliber rifle.

It was reported that Rev. Myers was found in the basement of the Leesburg church parsonage by Mrs. Myers shortly after she heard a gunshot. Rev. Myers had been despondent and in failing health for the past six months.

Rev. Myers was born June 18, 1900, in Petersburg, the son of Philip and Nancy (McCord) Myers. He served as the pastor at Dunkirk before being transferred to Leesburg. On June 7, 1924, he married Corena Sproule, who survives.

Surviving in addition to the widow are two daughters, Mrs. Lyle (Natalie) Tipton of Lafayette and Mrs. Donald (Janet) Gooch of Harvey, Ill.; one sister, Mrs. Samuel Keller of Allenspark, Colo.; and six grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. today (Wednesday) at the home of the service which will be conducted at 11 a.m. Thursday in the Warsaw funeral home. Interment will be in the Tippecanoe Memory Gardens at Lafayette.

Charles David Bungler, 7-month-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Donald Bungler of Benton and grandson of Mrs. Reva Hawks of Syracuse, died at 6 p.m. Saturday, June 5, of burns received when fire destroyed his parents' home.
