The Syracuse Yellow Jackets suffered their third straight setback of the year at the hands of the Wakarusa Indians by a score of 58 to 51. The game was highlighted with excitement and hustle on the part of both teams.

The Indians from Wakarusa led the Yellow Jackets throughout most of the first half with some pretty good outside shooting by the Indians' Bob Abel and Jack Jamison.
