Wawasee Warriors Win Third In A Row

The Warriors of Wawasee once again showed their driving power as they defeated Jintown 30-0 under the lights for the first time on the Warriors home field.

Rog Korenstra started the scoring off early in the first quarter with a 25 yard run around end. Bill Pipp came around shortly after the first TD and took a 27 yard pass from Donn May for the second touchdown. Korenstra again showed his mass muscle driving power as he plunged in from the four yard line for the third touchdown early in the second quarter. Tom Speicher ran 26 yards for the fourth touchdown in the fourth quarter and Steve Bahn ran a round end with a 66 yard run for the final TD of the game.

The Warriors' offense racked up 286 total yards rushing and passing to Jintown's 72 yards. The "Maulers" again held their opponent scoreless through the entire game. Bill Pipp and Ric Clingaman each had 7 tackles and Joe Baumgartner added 4 for the "Maulers".

The Warriors will be looking for their fourth consecutive win as they face Manchester October 5 at 10 a.m. at Manchester.
