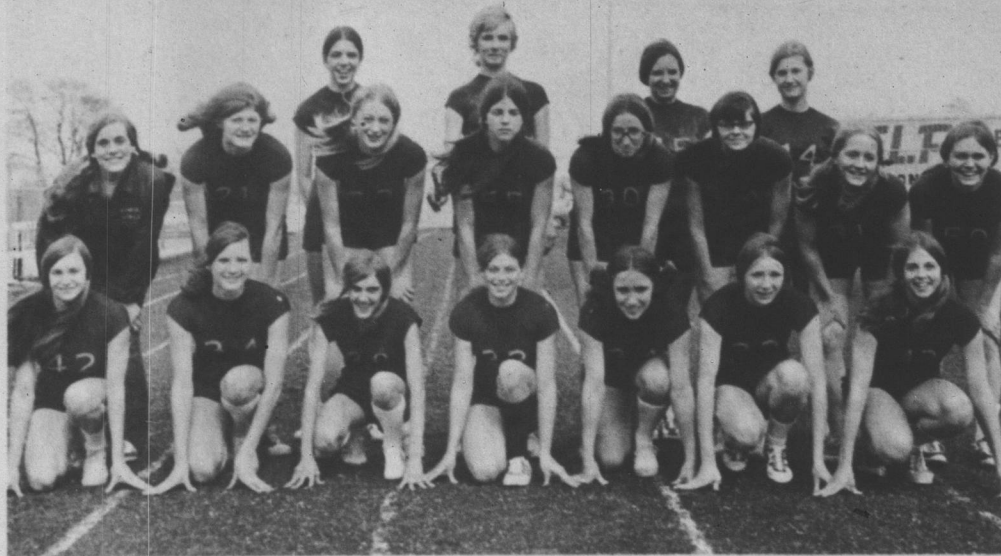

Wawasee will have 11 of the 143 girls competing to go to the regional meet held at Northridge on May 13. Wawasee's track record is six wins and no losses.

Nappanee Defeats Syracuse 78-31

Syracuse junior high school suffered its first loss of the track season to Nappanee last week, 78-31.

Syracuse got off to a slow start in the field events and was unable to overcome Nappanee's greater team strength. Nappanee swept the shot put, pole vault, mile and won both relays.

Steve Kroh lowered his winning

time in the half mile to 2:22.1 as he won his fourth straight race. Tim Morganthaler, Syracuse seventh grader, won Syracuse's only other first place in the high jump.

John Schacht set a new Syracuse record in the mile run as his 5:27.6 mark clipped five seconds off Eric Coburn's old record. Mike Fields was also under the old record in finishing a close second.

Steve Kroh and Jerry Yoder were both double winners for Syracuse. Yoder won the 60 and 100-yard dashes while Kroh won the 220-yard dash and also took the half mile for his fifth straight win in that event.

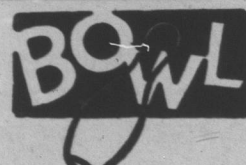
The score of the NorthWood match was 154-169 while the score of the Northridge match was 163-188.
