A total of 21 building permits were issued by building commissioner Harry VanHemert during the month at \$360 in fees, \$144 to be retained by the town and \$216 going to the building commissioner.

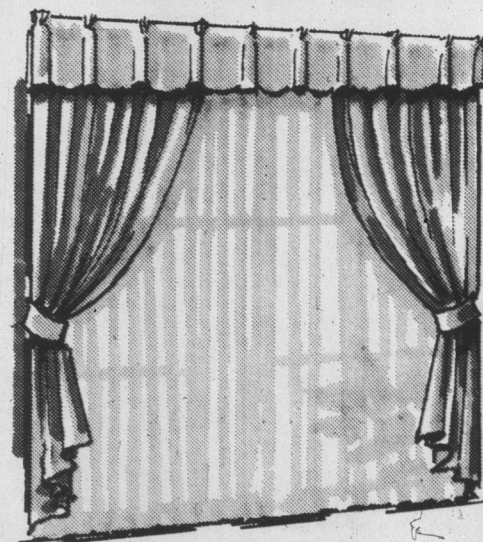
