### Lange stars as 'Kong' heroine

Not since the days of Marilyn Monroe and Kim Novak has Hollywood seen the creation of an important new female star, a process now happening to Jessica Lange, the heroine of the multi-million dollar contemporary version of "King Kong."

In a story that has all the elements of folklore, Jessica had never even been in Los Angeles when Dino De Laurentiis, who had seen photographs of her, had her jet to Hollywood on two hours' notice to do a screen test. He and his aides took one look at the test and gave her the part, one of the most sought-after roles in years.

Introduced at the largest press conference held in Hollywood in recent memory, Jessica lived up to expectations when she made her first public appearance held aloft in the hand of King Kong. Jessica's radiance was an

Honest is what is most apparent in Jessica, too. She has an ability to open up and reveal herself without being guarded or defensive, which generates an immediate warmth with the person to whom she is talking. On screen, director John Guillermin says, this quality will be dynamite.
