Clarence P. Moore, 89, formerly of Warsaw, died Friday, Dec. 4, at 7 p.m. in the Kosciusko Community Hospital. He was the father of Mrs. Mary Jane Thompson of Leesburg.

Moore a veteran of World War I, was driver for General "Black Jack" Pershing in Europe. He was a resident of Miller's Merry Manor in LaPorte and a retiree from Bendix Corporation in South Bend. He had been a mechanical engineer for that corporation.

Born in LaPorte on August 18, 1892, he later married Hulda M. Wedow on November 10, 1914, in that city. She preceded him in death in August. The Moores had resided in Warsaw for the past 16 years, moving from South Bend.

He was a member of the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Survivors in addition to his daughter, Mary Jane, are a son, Clarence ("Bud") Moore of Augusta, Ga.; two other daughters, Mrs. Betty Shaw of Valparaiso, and Mrs. Marjorie Hueckstedt of Colon, Mich.; 11 grandchildren; and 15 great-grandchildren.

CAMPBELL PICK-UP TRUCK IN ACCIDENT

Two injured in 2-car-truck accident late Friday night

Two cars and a pick-up truck were involved in an accident at 11:09 p.m. Friday on the Milford-Syracuse Road near the Dan Beer farm home.

Jeffrey A. Campbell, 22, of Milford, was driving east on the country road in his 1972 Chevrolet truck when his truck slid on the ice, went over a three and one-half foot embankment and struck a tree on the south side of the road. With Campbell was Rose Palmer, 18, also of Milford.

The truck was "totaled," and

both occupants were taken to the Goshen Hospital in the Syracuse EMS ambulance. Campbell suffered lacerations to his right-knee and Miss Palmer suffered facial, scalp and hip lacerations and a sprained right hip.

Robert W. Wright, 40, also of Milford, westbound in a 1970 Chevelle, recognized the Campbell truck and stopped to offer assistance.

Wright was out of his car when another car, a 1976 Chevrolet coupe driven by Donald D. Bice,

Jr., 22, also of Milford, westbound and not realizing the Wright car had stopped, slammed into the Wright vehicle.

There were no personal injuries resulting from the impact of the two cars, but the Wright car had damages to its rear bumper under \$200, while damages to the Bice car was estimated to be from \$200 to \$1,000 to the right front fender.

The triple-vehicle accident was investigated by deputy sheriff Tom Brindle and Milford night marshal Rich Schnieders.
