## Bake early, avoid rush

Holiday preparations begin early in many homes and part of that early preparation includes the holiday baking. Early baking helps to avoid that last minute rush. But once you've baked all those goodies for giving and family enjoyment, they should be stored properly to maintain their great taste and looks.

Baked goods must be stored properly to keep them fresh and appealing. Wrap yeast and quick breads in foil, plastic wrap or plastic bags and store in a cool, dry place. Avoid refrigerating yeast breads as they dry out and become stale more quickly. For longer storage, more than a few days, wrap unfrosted breads in moisture-vapor-proof wrap and freeze at zero degrees. Be sure to eliminate as much air as possible when packaging.

Match the proper storage with the right cookie. First, separate crisp and soft varieties and store them separately. Otherwise, they will become limp. Soft cookies and those with moist fillings should be stored in loosely covered containers. Most other varieties can be stored in containers with tight-fitting lids.

Candy is easily stored. Hard candies need only be covered in clear plastic wrap and kept in a cool place. All other candies should be covered and kept cool.

While making your holiday goodies, why not make extras for gift giving. A gift from your kitchen would be most welcomed. When deciding what to make, keep in mind several points: foods available to you; nourishment the product provides; appearance of the finished product — can it be wrapped and made "gift-y" cost;

and ease of preparation — you're already busy, so be realistic about the extra work you can handle.

The kitchen holds the makings for many holiday goodies. There's no need to limit yourself. Cheese spreads, dips, pates, salad dressings and jellies will please the most discriminating palates. And with some ingenuity, even the gift containers can be made from the many jars, cans and boxes found on the cupboard shelf. Wrap with brightly colored papers, foil or cellophane for a festive flair.

### PEPPERMINT CHIPPERS

1½ cup brown sugar  
1 cup vegetable shortening  
2 eggs  
1 tsp. vanilla  
2¼ cups ground oat flour  
½ tsp. soda  
½ tsp. salt  
1½ cup rolled oats  
1 cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces  
½ cup finely crushed peppermint candy

Beat together sugar and shortening until light and fluffy; blend in eggs and vanilla. Combine oat flour, soda and salt; add to shortening mixture, mixing well. Stir in oats, chocolate pieces, and candy. Drop by teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-11 minutes.

Cool two minutes on sheet and remove to wire cooling rack. Makes six dozen. To make ground oat flour, place 1½ cups rolled oats in blender or food processor. Cover; blend about 1 minute, stopping occasionally to stir oats. Makes 1 cup. Ground oat flour can be made ahead and stored in a lightly covered, cool, dry place up to six months.
