Financial aid workshops offered

Student financial aid workshops will be offered by Ivy Tech College Northcentral in South Bend and Warsaw. The workshops are designed for students currently enrolled in college or for students planning to attend college. The workshops are open to all area residents, and parents are encouraged to attend.

The emphasis will be on the proper completion of the new state and federal Financial Aid Forms, and on financial aid through guaranteed student loans. Financial aid applications must be filed before March 1, 1985 for the coming school year of 1985/86.

In Warsaw the workshop will take place at Ivy Tech, 106 N. Buffalo on Tuesday, Jan. 8, at 7 p.m.

In South Bend the financial aid workshops will be held at the main campus, 1534 W. Sample, on Thursday, Jan. 17, at 7 p.m. and on Friday, Jan. 18, at 1 p.m.
