Plymouth beats Wawasee, 23-7

For the Plymouth Rockies, it was an early Christmas gift. For the Wawasee Warriors, it was another loss — tainted by turnovers.


All the Rockies had to do was cash in on a couple first quarter miscues — which they gladly did — to spoil the Warriors' homecoming game last Friday night, 23-7.

Plymouth raced to a shocking 20-0 lead in the first 12 minutes. Following a 59-yard touchdown run by Quarterback Dave Hoover on an option play, Wawasee fumbled two consecutive kick-offs, spurring a pair of scores for the Rockies.

Plymouth (3-2) recovered the first fumble at the Warrior 32 yard line. Six plays later, Hoover fired a 14-yard touchdown pass to Tailback Charlie Pinkerton. Wawasee soon fumbled the next kick, with the Rockies taking possession on the Warrior 32 once more. Plymouth responded when Chad Morlan scored on a nine-yard run, capping the short nine-play drive. Mark Moore followed two of the three scores with extra point kicks.

Moore added a 30-yard field goal in the third quarter, making it 23-0. This score was also sparked by a turnover since a Wawasee player was ruled to have touched the ball during a punt return.

"That first quarter killed us, just killed us," said Warrior Head Coach Myron Dickerson, whose team fell to 1-4. "We just took ourselves right out of the game, which we can't afford to do in the first 12 minutes. Now, I just think that we have to stress some

of the basics again," he added.

On the other hand, Plymouth Coach Bill Nixon was "happy with the win," but reasoned that his team slacked off in the second half. "I guess we played fairly well," he said. "But you know me, I'm never satisfied with anything. I coach for performance, not just winning and on the performance end, we sure could have done a lot better."

The Rockies didn't do bad, either, as the visitors showcased a healthy running attack led by Pinkerton, who carried 30 times for 113 yards. Hoover added another chunk of rushing yardage as well as passing for 35 more, hitting three of five attempts for one touchdown.

Overall, the Plymouth netted 248 yards and nine first downs. In

addition, Linebacker Tom Wiers recovered all four Wawasee fumbles as well as playing an aggressive defense with his teammates.

The Warriors totaled 169 yards and eight first downs. Yet, field position was again poor since Wawasee had to march 80 yards for its only score, which came with 4:38 left in the contest. Brad Traviola hit Lance Lantz with a 29-yard touchdown strike following a pair of good running plays by Sophomore Mike Meek, who gained 34 yards on five carries.

"He ran the ball well for us," Dickerson said of Meek. "When we got our hands on the ball, we were able to run some traps and they worked well. But by then, we were down by three touchdowns and running the ball takes a lot of time, so we had to go to our passing game sooner. It's just so

tough when we put ourselves in a hole because it takes us right out of our game plan."

Traviola had a fair passing performance, completing seven of 15 tries for 97 yards and one touchdown. He was intercepted once.

"We did come back in the second half and won it," Dickerson explained. "But what does that count for? All four quarters count and winning a half really doesn't mean anything. Yet, we played half decent defense considering the holes they were put in...we still need work with our linebackers because pursuit is a problem with us. That 59-yard touchdown run proved it," he added.

Therefore, the Warriors will have something to prove next Friday as they play at Warsaw, which currently leads the Nor-

thern Lakes Conference with a 4-0 league record. The Tigers edged Goshen, 28-26 last Friday for their fourth straight win. Wawasee will try to end its four-game losing streak.
