**THE RIALTO**

Steve Reeves, whose mighty muscles and outstanding physique will be seen next Sunday at the Rialto Theatre in the title role of "Hercules," new film adventure-romance in which he co-stars with lovely Sylva Koscina, is living proof that mighty bodies are made, not born.

Young Reeves, who first won the title of "Mr. Pacific" and then went on in quick succession to be named "Mr. America", "Mr. World" and "Mr. Universe," not to mention his fanciest title, the French "Le Plus Bel Athlete du Monde" (The World's Handsomest Athlete), was a skinny kid who got pushed around by every bully on the block. Boro and raised in San Francisco, Steve had to deliver papers after school in order to help out his family's finances. At the age of 16 he weighed a scrawny 155 pounds sparsely spread over his height of six feet one inch.

**Hills Muscle Builders**

Fortunately for Steve—although he didn't think so at the time! — San Francisco has the steepest hills of any city in the world, and Steve's daily chore of pedalling his bike up and down those hills started to develop the muscles of his calves to the hardness of solid rock. Today, through using the same natural laws of exercise that are followed by the jungle animals, Steve Reeves' measurements, which have won him fame and fortune, are: weight, 203; chest, 47½; waist 29; arms, 17; and calf, 18. All that perfection plus the Reeves taper torso, the famous flaring wedge from broad, he-man shoulders to a narrow, steel-muscled waist!
