RESORT TO ARMS. The Utica Patriot of May 10 contains the following paragraph: "By a gentleman directly from Vermont, we are informed that in an attempt of the inhabitants to take a large raft to Montreal, contrary to the embargo laws, they were resisted on lake Champlain by two sloops belonging to the government, when an action took place in which fourteen or fifteen men were wounded. The raft escaped and proceeded to its place of destination.
