United States Saline, July 29, 1808

Being willing to promote the intentions of government in letting the above works I have tried many ways to but little effect—I have frequently altered the regulations to see if I could hit on some method that there would be no objections to—but in vain—I have thought proper [with the content of the Governor] to make one trial more, and take this method of giving it publicity.

All persons wanting salt for their own consumption (and coming or sending for that purpose) will be supplied immediately.

I shall commence on the 15th day of august to receive applications and the applicants money for salt which will be discharged in the course of two weeks—the quantity will be regulated by the number of applicants and the quantity of salt made—I shall continue to receive applications until 10 o'clock every other Monday morning and no longer.—Those that make an entry will not be entitled to make another in less than eight weeks—any person may act by agency provided there is no fraud discovered—every person must take his salt as it becomes due—those who deposited money for salt between the 11th February & the 1st. of April will not be allowed the privilege of an entry before the 12th of September and all those of that description who have not received their salt are requested to attend and receive it before the 15th of august otherwise they will break on my future arrangements.
