By the President of the U States.

WHEREAS, by the first section of an Act of Congress passed on the 31st day of March 1808, entitled "An act concerning the sale of the lands of the U States and for other purposes," the President of the U States is authorized to cause certain public lands to be offered for sale;

WHEREFORE, I JAMES MONROE, President of the U. States, in conformity with the said act, and other acts of Congress, providing for the sale and disposal of the Lands of the U. States south of Tennessee, do hereby declare and make known that public sales, for the disposal agreeably to law, of the public Lands, in the district of Pearl river, bounded on the west by the Chickasaw bay river on the south by the parallel of the 31 of north latitude, on the east by the Mobile and Tombigby rivers, and on the north by the Creeks Santabogue and Bogue, Homo (the one falling into the Tombigby and the other into the Chickasaw rivers) which have been surveyed and returned to the Register of the Land office at St. Stephens and which have not been disposed of or excepted from sale by law, shall be held at St. Stephens on the River Tombigby, on the first Monday of July next and continue till the said lands have been offered for sale.
