By the President of the U. States.

WHEREAS by an act of congress, passed on the 3d day of March, 1815, entitled 'An act to provide for the ascertaining and surveying of the boundary lines fixed by the treaty with the Creek Indians and for other purposes,' the president of the United States is authorized to cause the lands acquired by the said treaty to be offered for sale when surveyed, and whereas the following townships have been surveyed, in the District of Alabama, in the Mississippi territory, to wit:

Townships 11 and 12	in range 13
10, 11 and 12	14
9, 10, 11 and 12	15
9, 10, 12 and 13	16
13 14, 15, 16 and 17	17
13, 14, 15, 16 and 17	18
13 14, 15 and 16	19
13 14, 15 and 16	20

THEREFORE, I, JAMES MONROE, President of the United States, in conformity with the said act, do hereby declare and make known, that public sales for the disposal (agreeably to wail of the lands above described, shall) be held at Milledgeville, in the state of Georgia, on the first Monday in August next, and shall remain open for three weeks and no longer, the sales to commence with the township first above named, and proceed in the order in which they are named.
