ITEMS OF NEWS.

We are informed (says the Philadelphia Gazette) that the Franklin 74, com. Stewart, is under sailing orders and will leave the Delaware as soon as the Hon. Richard Rush is ready to embark. The Franklin is to convey Mr. Rush to London, who is appointed Minister Plenipotentiary to the court of St. James. After landing the Minister it is said he will visit the Mediterranean.

HAYTIAN SCHOOLS.

Chrisophe, king of Hayti, has adopted the Lancasterian system of education in his dominions, and has established schools deriving their support from government, and promulgating instruction in the rudiments of primary education, without expense to individuals. He has also ordered a sale of the national domains of the kingdom with several exceptions.

NEW YORK, Sept. 22. CLEOPATRA'S BARGE.

The brig Bee, capt. Springsteen, arrived at this port on Saturday morning from Barcelona capt. S spoke the Cleopatra Barge, of Salem going out with her owner, Geo. Crowninshield, Esq, on a tour of pleasure in the Mediterranean. Capt. S. was credibly informed at Barcelona, that this beautiful vessel had been visited by upwards of 18 000 persons during his very short stay of 4 days at that place, and was obliged to leave the port sooner than Mr. C. otherwise intended on account of the immense number of people who flocked from all quarters to see her. The captain-general of the province, Castanos and staff, intend int's family, foreign consuls residents at Barcelona, many of the nobility, chief magistrates of the city, officers of the navy and army, ladies of the first rank and distinction, and even friars, were among the number of those whose curiosity was attracted by this rare specimen of American taste and genius.

The British Government are fitting out armed vessels to protect their trade against South-American privateers.

KINGSTON, (Jam) Aug. 13.

By the Christiana we learn that 6000 Spanish troops, which had served under Lord Wellington in the Peninsula, had arrived at Lagaira from Old Spain, to go against the insurgents.

In the night of June 14th, a dreadful shipwreck took place off Point la Hogue, near Haven. The Pegasus from Martinique with colonial produce and full of passengers, struck on the rocks off Bas-Blanchard. The deck instantly separated from the hull, and for six hours the crew were driven about upon it. The captain and six passengers were one by one washed off in the sea; at day break however, several intrepid pilots made for the wreck in their boats, and succeeded in taking off the remaining crew and passengers. The captain who perished, is blamed for the loss of this vessel; he was warned several times to keep the land during the night; but he was too obstinate. One of the passengers died soon after being carried on shore.

The Baroness de Stael Holstein daughter of the celebrated Neckar, died on the 15th of July, in the 50th year of her age. She left a son and daughter the latter married to the Duke de Broglie, a peer of France. A letter from Vienna of the 2d of July mentions, the mountain called the Haus-

ruck, in Upper Austria has disappeared, and its place is supplied by a lake. This mountain was very high, and the country around took its name from it. Since the preceding month, several phenomena had warned the inhabitants that something awful would happen, and there were frequent subterraneous noises heard. About a dozen cottages which were built in various parts of the hill, have of course disappeared; but it was not known whether any perished in them.

Old Neptune's Dominion affords as many wonders now a-days as was exhibited on land, and its inhabitants imitating the lords of terra firma seem to be either in a state of civil commotion or emigrating to the shores of the new continent in search of freedom. Besides the Cape Ann serpent, and the Kraken seen on the Coast of South-America, by capt Fanning we hear of the mermaid being seen on our coast, of new and non descript species of fish being taken in our harbors, and of unprecedented shoals of herring choking up the mouths of our rivers. To these wonders may be added the serpent of Lake Erie, the existence of which has been satisfactorily demonstrated to us. Independent of other corroborating statements, Mr. Walton who resides near the borders of the Lake, and who is represented as a man of veracity, states that he has seen the Lake Serpent repeatedly and fired several balls at him, at the distance of twenty rods, without the least apparent effect. He describes him as about sixty feet long, of a copper colour, with brilliant eyes, four inches in diameter. He has seen him in a coil & extended upon the water.
