Barros has not been so fortunate; but we do not believe that had the same opportunities offered, he would have been less worthy. The surprise and indecision which he evinced when the attack was made on the Chesapeake, and which left him in doubt how to act on the occasion, has never we believe, by his worst enemies been imputed to cowardice; and we do not hesitate to say, that in the whole business he has been a *wronged and injured man*. The whole navy admits him to be a first rate seaman, an intelligent and accomplished gentleman,—why then has his restoration to his former honors been so long delayed? There seems a disposition in our country to crush the *unfortunate*, whatever may be their talents or their merit.

We stop the press to announce that Commodore Stephen Decatur breathed his last at about half past ten last night. His case was attended from the first with those alarming symptoms which indicate approaching dissolution, vomiting of blood, &c. The sympathy this painful tragedy has occasioned, is indescribable. Mr. Decatur was in an agony of despair.—What consolation can be offered to this very amiable lady in her grief?

Revolutionary Pensions.—This subject has occupied much of the time of the House of Representatives for several days past. It appears probable, at present, that the Pension Law will not be touched at all; not that it is not acknowledged that frauds more or less numerous may have been committed under it but that it is supposed no precaution will prevent them. The bill reported with that view is now amended so as to be completely a blank; and it is doubtful whether that blank will be filled with any thing or not.

NEW-YORK, MARCH 20.
The Court of Session for this city closed their term on Saturday evening. The trial of Robert M. Goodwin for man-slaughter, occupied the court during the whole of last week. The case was conducted on the part of the state, by Mr. Van Wyck, prosecuting attorney, assisted by Messrs. Wells, Griffin, and Blake, and for the prisoner by Messrs. Emmett, Hoffman, D. B. Ogden, St. Price, and P. J. Munro. The arguments of the counsel, on both sides, are spoken of in terms of high admiration by those who had an opportunity to hear them. The case was ably summed up on Friday evening, by his honor the Mayor, and the cause delivered to the jury at 2 o'clock on Saturday morning, when the court adjourned to 10 o'clock. In the course of the forenoon the jury came into court, and informed that they had not been able to agree on a verdict. They were returned to their room for further consideration, and at 11 o'clock, P. M. came in again, still unable to agree, when they were dismissed, and the prisoner remanded for another trial. A motion was made that he might be admitted to bail, which did not prevail; and he of course remains in confinement till the next term.
