

**ITEMS**—The cause of the United States against Daniel D. Tompkins, for between 11 and \$2000, was decided by the District court, in New York on the 6th, in favour of the defendant. The jury, it appears, were of opinion, that there was due to the Vice President, from the United States, the sum of \$136,799 & 76 cents, over and above the sum for which the suit was brought against him.

Mr. Torres, was received by the president on Wednesday last, as charge d'affaires of the republic of Colombia.

Counterfeit notes of ten dollars on the Bank of North Carolina, and notes altered from three to one hundred, on the same Bank are in circulation.

**Turkey**—There is still some talk of a division of Turkey among the holy allies—Russia, Austria and Great Britain.
