Trunk Line Traffic Managers Decide to Restore West-Bound Rates on Northwestern Lumber Rates on Other Railroad News.

Trunk Line Traffic Managers, New York, June 8.—At the meeting of the trunk line carriers yesterday it was decided to restore west-bound rates and lake freight rates, and all-rail rates to the rate cutting broke out before the rate cutting broke out. The Baltimore & Ohio agreed to maintain rates. No reference was made to the recent demand by the receivers of the company for a larger share of the business.

Commissioner J. F. Godard says that the question of percentages did not come up at the meeting. In fact, it is understood that at the recent conference between the Baltimore & Ohio receivers and President Deves and Chairman, attention was called to the fact that the recent decision of the Supreme Court prevents any arbitrary division of the business. There is, therefore, no present intention of referring the question of the arbitration of adjustment. The matter of rates, however, is admitted to be in a state of confusion, and the attention of the plan of regulating them was determined upon at yesterday's meeting.

Passes Missing.—The Pennsylvania is in search of a ticket, or rather a pass. According to the trunk line carriers, the Pennsylvania passenger office, an employe of the road who holds a responsible position got a pass from Pittsburgh to Chicago, Indiana.
