

EMMETT SCOTT PERSONNEL DIRECTOR

CHESTER, Pa., July 10. (ANP)—Assuming full-time duty at the Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Company, Dr. Emmett J. Scott, director of personnel for the new plant under construction, arrived at his office on the first of July and plunged into the welter of work ahead of him in making selections from the thousands of applications he has received since the announcement was made that Sun was planning a new yard which would employ 9,000 Negroes.
