The Indianapolis Hebrew Congregation filed an appeal in Superior Court Wednesday to the decision of the Meridian Hills Zoning Board which denied the temple's application to build in that community.

City JCRC Warns Merchants  
Of Newspaper Ad Racket

Unethical advertising solicitation by New York newspapers in Indianapolis has caused numerous complaints to the Indianapolis Jewish Community Relations Council, according to David Sawyer, executive director.

Local firms, both Jewish and non-Jewish, have received billings in past weeks from such publications as "The Jewish Mail," "Bitzaron" and "The Jewish Spectator."

These ads had not been previously solicited by these publications to these firms, but the impression was given that the firms had ordered them, that the ads had been published, and that the firm owed the newspapers the amounts billed.

In some instances, the ads had been clipped from holiday editions of The Jewish Post, which had been ordered in advance by the firm with The Post. The impression was deliberately given by some of the New York papers that they themselves had run those ads.

"Several firms are especially angered by Bitzaron's appeal,"

Sawyer said. "It had the unmitigated chutzpah to attach a 'Please—Prompt Remittance Appreciated' sticker on the bills."

Bitzaron, Inc., lists itself as "the fortress of Hebrew journalism in America" and lists among its sponsors some of the most prominent leaders of American and world Jewry.

"In my opinion," Sawyer affirmed, "Jewish publications which purport to fight for liberty on behalf of men of all faiths, and against tyranny, bigotry and oppression, and who receive contributions in their special holiday edition as an expression of good will, inter-faith and inter-community understanding, should be much more alerted to

Israeli Culture Has Its Beauty

Rabbi Slobo Mediates Agreement  
Among Kosher Slaughterers

A satisfactory settlement has been reached by the South Side spiritual leaders and shochet, which culminated in a contract drawn up last Monday night.

The controversy, reported in last week's Post, revolved around the difference of opinion concerning Rabbi Isaac Casuto's qualifications as a shochet under Ashkenazic law.

The agreement completely vindicates Rabbi Casuto, according to Rabbi Raphael Slobo, who mediated the dispute.

From now on, Rabbi Maurice Schwartz, Cantor Portnov and Rev. Greenberger will do all the kosher slaughtering in Indianapolis. Rabbi Casuto will supervise the slaughtering, and Rabbi Slobo will inspect the shechita, or knives, used.

The agreement, reprinted here was signed by the shochet, Rabbi Casuto, Rabbi Schwartz, Cantor Portnov and Rev. Greenberger, of the Sephardic Congregation, Shara Tefilla, the Central Hebrew Congregation and the United Hebrew Congregation, respectively.

By the initiative of the Orthodox Rabbi Raphael Slobo, the spiritual leader of Knesses Israel Congregation, a meeting was held Monday night, Dec. 17, 1951, in his home, about the Shochet's differences. There were present Rabbi Isaac Casuto, spiritual leader of the Sephardic Congregation, and the three Shochatim, Rabbi Maurice Schwartz, spiritual leader of Shara Tefilla, the cantor Abraam Portnov and the Rev. Solomon Greenberger.

By the wise directive of Rabbi Slobo, the discussion about the shechita was friendly and sincerely discussed among all of them, to find a satisfactory solution. Consequently, it was decided that Rabbi and Shochet Casuto will be the responsible director, or inspector, for all kosher meat at the packing house, and Rabbi Schwartz, Cantor Portnov and Rev. Greenberger will continue to be the slaughterers for all the kosher butchers of Indianapolis.

Rabbi Raphael Slobo and Rabbi William P. Greenfeld were nominated for the Kashruth of the city.

JCCA Winter Lecture Series  
To Include Prinz, Redelheim

A three-part winter lecture series has been announced by Irwin Katz, president of the Jewish Community Center Association, to be presented free to the Indianapolis Jewish community.

The lectures will be delivered at 8:15 p. m. Tuesday, Jan. 15; Wednesday, Feb. 13, and Wednesday, March 12, in the newly redecorated auditorium of Kirshbaum center.

Rabbi Joachim Prinz, the first speaker, will be presented in cooperation with the Indianapolis chapter of the American Jewish Congress.

Rabbi Prinz, a spiritual leader in Berlin from 1925 to 1937, was one of the first German rabbis to preach Zionism, in spite of a dominant anti-Zionist stand on the

part of German Jewry. The nazis expelled him in 1937, after repeated attacks on the government and constant urging of the people to migrate to what was then Palestine.

He is now chairman of the National Administrative committee of the American Jewish Congress, and president of the New Jersey state Congress region.

Abraham A. Reidelheim will be the second speaker. The chairman of the National Administrative Council of the Zionist Organization of America, he will be presented in cooperation with the local ZOA district.

## Native of Jerusalem

Redelheim is also a member of the praesidium of the World Zionist Actions committee and a journalist and public relations counsellor. He is a native of Jerusalem.

The third speaker has not yet been announced, but will be brought to Indianapolis in conjunction with the American Jewish Committee.

The subjects of the speakers are not yet known, but it is expected that their topics will be in consonance with the philosophy behind the JCCA sponsorship of the series.

## "Center To Be Jewish"

"We are striving to make the center a truly Jewish center," Al Dobrof, executive director, told The Post.

"We want it to be a place where every member of the community can come in and feel at ease discussing Jewish topics. Of course, we want to carry on and even expand our special interest groups—arts, crafts, clubs, and so forth.

"But we also want it to have the kind of atmosphere in which it seems natural for people to develop their Jewish interests and gain in Jewish knowledge."

Kirshbaum To Sponsor Concert,  
Featuring Stanley Weiner

Stanley Weiner will perform in a concert to be sponsored at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 4, by the Jewish Community Center Association.

A large committee has arranged for the presentation, and 400 tickets will go on sale shortly, at \$1.20 each, for a program in the Booth Tarkington Civic Theater.

The first violinist and concertmaster of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra will be accompanied by Edwin Biltcliffe. The major number he will play will be the Baal Shem suite, by Ernest Bloch.

"This will be a Jewish work, in every sense of the word," Weiner told The Post. "It was dedicated by the composer to his mother, and consists of three movements: Vidui, or Contrition; Nigun, or Improvisation, and Simchas Torah, or Rejoicing.

Baal Shem portrays three pictures of Chassidic life."

Dr. and Mrs. Howard Kahn and Dr. and Mrs. Bernard Rosenak head the advisory committee planning the program. It will not be a fund-raising affair, but will be non-profit, as a contribution to local Jewish cultural interest, according to Al Dobrof, Kirshbaum director.

Other members of the advisory committee are Mr. and Mrs. Joseph M. Bloch, Maurice Good-

man, Mrs. J. A. Goodman, Mr.

and Mrs. Leonard Strauss and Mrs. Alexander Wolf.

A steering committee also has been set up, comprising Drs. and Mmes. Ebner Blatt, Mortimer Mann, Louis H. Segar and Victor Teixler, and Messrs. and Mmes. Philip Adler Jr., Ralph Cole, Charles F. Efroymsen, Julian A. Kiser, Max Klezmer, Walter Lichtenstein, Liebert Mossler and Leonard Solomon.

Weiner, a native of Baltimore, is in his second year as concertmaster of the Indianapolis Symphony. He was a laureate, or prize-winner, in the Jacques Thibaud international competition for violinists in Paris. He became concertmaster at 22 under Leonard Bernstein, of the New York City Symphony, which has since passed from the scene.

"My musical career began at 16 months," he jokingly told The Post. "My father was a violinist and my mother was, at one time, a singer."

**Grandson of Famous Beilis Case Attorney To Be Indianapolis Symphony Guest Artist**

The grandson of an attorney in the famous Beilis case in Russia will be the guest pianist of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra this week-end.

He is Gary Graffman, who will be making his second appearance in Indianapolis. His grandfather was Arnold Margolin, a defense lawyer in a case which shook the crumbling foundations of the Czarist government in Russia.

The bitterly anti-Semitic government had trumped up a blood libel case against Mendel Beilis, a Jewish brick-yard owner, alleging that he had murdered a Christian child for its blood. It was so widely known and clearly proven that the child was a victim of thieves that not even the government's hand-picked judge and jury would enter a verdict against the defendant.

On the other hand, some of the outstanding figures the world over, rising in moral

indignation, lent their voices to the defense of Beilis. A second trial failed just as flatly, and Beilis came to the United States while the Czar licked mortal wounds to his prestige.

Graffman's father was a school-mate of Fabien Sevitzyk in St. Petersburg, Russia, and they maintained correspondence after they came to the United States. When Graffman was eight years old, Sevitzyk heard him perform, and was so impressed that he placed the lad in the Philadelphia Simfonieta, a string ensemble which he then directed.

By the time Graffman was 10, Sevitzyk had succeeded to his present position, as director of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. He brought Graffman in as a guest performer, in the boy's first appearance with a symphony orchestra. Since then, he has performed with most of the major ones.

Graffman toured in Europe the last two summers. He told The Post he had no experience there in regard to his being Jewish.

**Roumanian In Israel Seeks Relatives Here**

## Premier is Flayed From All Sides Ben Gurion's Criticism Of U.S. Zionists Hit

NEW YORK (NJP)—For the first time since the establishment of the state, all sections of the Jewish people were in agreement.

The agreement was on Premier David Ben-Gurion's attack last week in the Knesset on American Zionists.

Even the American Council for Judaism agreed with the Zionist Organization of America, although their emphasis was, as natural, entirely different.

President Benjamin Browdy called it an "unfortunate outburst stemming from the emotional stress which the Israel government is undergoing."

Israel too joined in belaboring the Prime Minister.

Ha'aretz, the independent daily editorially took exception to Ben-Gurion's remarks. Haboker, which is the organ of the General Zionist Party, was even more critical. It asserted editorially that the Prime Minister's words "caused much distress and were insulting not only to American Zionist leaders, but to Israeli public."

The Premier charged that Zionist leadership in the United States "went bankrupt since the establishment of the Jewish state." As evidence of that situation he cited the fact that there were "not five leaders who got up to go to Israel after the state was established." At the same time he asserted that while he did not maintain that wide settlement by Zionist leaders would have prodded the masses into going to Israel, such a course "would have proved that Zionism was not void of meaning at least in the eyes of its leaders."

Ben-Gurion was speaking against motions to debate the curtailment of immigration. Dr. Arieh Altman had produced figures tracing the steady decline of the monthly immigration rate from 30,000 in April to 5,713 last month. Altman and Simha Babeh implied that the Jewish Agency, which assumed responsibility for immigration, had been motivated by considerations of economic hardship when it curtailed immigration.

### NO LASH OVER HEADS

Ben-Gurion said the problem confronting Israel today is how to induce American Jews to come to Israel when there is no whip over their heads. All the earlier waves of immigration

had come under the threat of the lash, and the American Jews cannot be expected to be different, Ben-Gurion said.

Baruch Zuckerman, president of the Labor Zionist Organization of America, the counterpart of Ben-Gurion's Mapai party said he didn't "believe that Ben-Gurion had said some of the things attributed to him."

Even if he did there is no reason to make any issue out of them," he added. He saw no reason why the incident should affect Zionist morale in the U. S., and said that the UJA conference in Atlantic City last weekend was "in no way" affected by the PM's attack.

**DON'T TAKE TOO SERIOUSLY**  
Nahum Goldmann, addressing the UJA conference, advised against taking too seriously

what the Israelis—even Government Ministers—say about the devotion of American Zionists.

Officials of the ZOA however, took a different view. They held that the continued attacks on American Zionism, were having a serious effect on the rank and file of U. S. Zionists.

Pinkhos Churgin, president of the Mizrahi Organization of America (religious Zionists) attributed the attack by Ben-Gurion "to the urgent circumstances" in which Israel finds itself. He suggested that instead of criticizing, the leadership of Israel should correct its mistake of not having utilized the tremendous enthusiasm the birth of the new state aroused among American Jews: By reviving that enthusiasm, the results so earnestly desired by Ben-Gurion will be achieved, Churgin said.

### ROSENWALD JOINS IN

The implications of the speech by Ben-Gurion were strongly rejected in the statement by Lesing J. Rosenwald, president of the American Council for Judaism.

our status as individual Americans than it has concerning the rights of Americans of any other faith with whom we are joined in attempting to meet and solve the manifold problems of American life. We reject and vigorously repudiate any implication that it has such rights or authority," Rosenwald declared.

"We furthermore resent and repudiate Ben-Gurion's implication that our attachments to the United States are or will be determined by economic considerations; nor are they determined by the manpower requirements of any foreign nation. Ben-Gurion's statement has made it clear that the problem of immigration to Israel is no longer on a humanitarian basis but is needed to supply Israel with manpower. This is an Israeli national problem. It is not a Jewish problem and Americans of Jewish faith have no responsibility whatsoever in meeting that Israeli problem."

### UTTERLY UNACCEPTABLE

"It is utterly unacceptable to us," Rosenwald said, "that the chief executive of a foreign state should, in an official statement to his own government, imply that our relationship to the United States is, in any sense or for any reason at all, anything but unqualified and permanent, throughout the good and bad fortunes of our country."

The ZOA statement asserted that it has become a popular pastime in some party circles in Israel to shift the blame upon American Zionists for internal difficult situations which inevitably arise from economic and other hardships faced by a newly born country.

"This was unfortunate because the entire question of immigration of American Jews into Israel had been thoroughly thrashed out at the last World Zionist Congress in Jerusalem when American Zionist leaders

# Quota \$15 0,500, 000; Ask Bond Cooperation

ATLANTIC CITY (NJP)—The United Jewish Appeal annual conference here set a goal for the first time in three years—\$15,500,000, criticized the lack of coordination nationally between the bond drive and the UJA, and heard reports that \$85,000,000 had been collected by the UJA in 1951.

Edward M. M. Warburg, was drafted as general chairman for the 1952 drive by the delegates.

Eddie Cantor will head the drive, which began this week in communities throughout the country and will terminate at Miami Beach, Fla. on Feb. 23 when the UJA will formally inaugurate its fourteenth annual campaign.

### MORE UJA-BOND COORDINATION

The Conference unanimously called for a greater degree of national and local coordination in planning the drives of the United Jewish Appeal and the State of Israel Bond organization.

The resolution urged three main lines of action.

1. That local communities set up coordinating committees where none now exist.
2. That all local coordinating committees meet immediately to develop the necessary plans for 1952.
3. That the National Coordinating Committee meet immediately to institute "action to develop a greater degree of coordination on the national level between the United Jewish Appeal and the Bond Organization than was achieved in 1951."

Hailing Israel as a democratic "symbol of hope and strength" in the feudal-ridden Near East, Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas told the conference that "if a tiny fraction of the money we have wasted around the world in supporting corrupt, reactionary and vicious regimes had been spent in Israel, that country today would have no problems."

### DON'T REPEAT BLUNDER, SILVER URGES

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, the noted Zionist leader, urged the United States not to repeat "the tragic blunder of Great Britain" in appeasing the Arab States at the expense of Israel. He called for "large-visioned statesmanship" and declared it must be the firm resolve of American Jews "to stand by the State of Israel through its present trials and difficulties."

In addition to drafting Warburg as general chairman, the conference reselected its 1951 leaders. Renamed as national UJA chairmen were William Rosenwald, Rudolf G. Sonneborn and Rabbi Jonah B. Wise. I. Edwin Goldwasser and Jacob Sincoff were re-named as national co-treasurers, Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz as executive vice-chairman, and Mrs. S. Alexander Brailove as chairman of the national women's division.

The United Palestine Appeal will require \$147,825,000 in 1952; the Joint Distribution Committee, \$23,507,300; and the United Service for New Americans, \$4,068,200.

Benjamin G. Browdy, president of both the Zionist Organization of America and the Palestin Foundation Fund, stayed away from the United Jewish Appeal conference because he was not invited as PFF head to address any of the sessions.

## Abbell Hits Jewish Groups Giving Honors to Non and Converted Jews

CHICAGO—A bitter attack on Jewish organizations which use non-Jews to grace their programs was unleashed here by Maxwell Abbell, leading national Conservative figure, in a letter to The Sentinel.

Abbell, who is a past president of the United Synagogue of America, lay organization of the Conservative Movement, told of a "local Theological College" whose dinner was "presided over by a person married to a non-Jew whose children were not being brought up in the Jewish faith..." (The Hebrew Theological College of Chicago, is the only such college in Chicago.)

Abbell opened his denunciation by praising The Sentinel for attacking the practice editorially.

He asserted that the Orthodox communities "are

the worst offenders..."

"Can anyone ever point to a Christian church or Theological seminary," he asked, "felling it incumbent upon them at a dedicatory exercise or at a special event of any kind whatsoever to invite a Jew, be he ever so outstanding a person in the community or in the nation, to grace its functions?"

He declared that "synagogue after synagogue and temple after temple has violated the canons of good taste and declared a voluntary bankruptcy of their Judaism in doing just this sort of thing."

Continuing, Abbell charged that "these Gentile speakers who grace Jewish occasions are for the most part paid persons who have absolutely no interest whatsoever in the particular institution or activity and who would just as soon speak for an Arab group or some Christian group unfriendly to

the Jewish people." He cited the case of Dorothy Thompson, who he said "used to grace Hadassah platforms and now not only speaks for the American Council for Judaism, but is active in organizing pro-Arab groups."

Abbell attacked the "many Jewish organizations including Orthodox Theological colleges, welfare funds, and federations" who give "places of honor on the boards and even at the heads of the institutions as well as on the platform of institutional functions as presiding chairmen of meetings, conferences, etc., to persons who have been and are traitors of our own people, men who have married out of their faith and have espoused the faith of their wives, bringing up their children as non-Jews and discrediting everything Jewish in their own personal lives."

**Business Goes Where It Is Invited—

### Synagogue Leaders Oppose School Prayers

NEW YORK (NJP)—Without mentioning the recommendation of the New York State Board of Regents that the school day be opened with a prayer (NJP, Dec. 7, 1951), Rabbi Simon G. Kramer last week installed as president of the Synagogue Council of America, questioned the advisability of such a move. Rabbi Kramer told the audience of lay and rabbinic representatives of the three wings of American Judaism that while religion must teach the importance of values other than material gain, the "introduction of oaths of allegiance and prayers in public schools will not

solve this vexing problem." The Joint Advisory Committee of the Synagogue Council, representing all three wings of American Judaism, and the National Community Relations Advisory Council, is considering a policy statement on the prayer recommendation of the Board of Regents.

The Association of Reform Rabbis has joined in the opposition to the recommendation.

The Association said it felt "strongly that its introduction into the school system is fraught with potential complications and difficulties."

"Furthermore, it is seriously doubtful that the enforced, mechanical recitation . . . of this prayer will induce the spirit of reverence, faith and devout worship so earnestly sought . . . and rather than produce respect for prayer, it may make for indifference toward it in church, synagogue and home."

The Association contended that the inculcation of "faith in God in the children" and strengthening "their habits of worship and their ways of religious and ethical living" was the responsibility of the homes, the churches and synagogues.

## Zionist Official Denies Memphis Acted Against ZOA Projects Fund

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (NJP)—Leo R. Burson, chairman of the administrative committee of the Southeastern Zionist Region denied vigorously that he had stated that the Memphis Zionist District "was not in accord with the views of the Zionist Organization of America with regards to projects fund of the Zionist Organization of America."

"I have made no such statement" Burson told The Post. (The Post did not credit such a statement to Burson. The complete text of the views credited to Burson by Post correspondent Bernard Schnierer, (NJP, Nov. 23, 1951) was:

According to Leo Burson chairman of the Administrative Committee of the Southeastern Zionist Region, the views of the Memphis District had been accepted at the cent convention of the Region, and the handling of special projects with specific localities in Israel expressly authorized. "What we seek," Burson said, "is to know the problems of the people we are aiding, and we want them to know us. This is impossible of accomplishment if channelled through a national arrangement."

Burson said that he had wired ZOA officials that the Post article regarding the "District and myself is a gross misinterpretation of action recently taken by Memphis Board."

### AID TO BE DIRECT

The Post news story stated that the Memphis Board voted "a program to be worked out in direct conjunction with the recipients in Israel." The news item quoted Abe D. Waldauer, chairman of the committee to study and recommend projects to the District as saying: "We are not concerned with controlling the thought or political viewpoint of the people of Israel."

The Post's story said that the Memphis Board expressed dissatisfaction with the national organization's handling of projects and voted a program to be worked out in direct conjunction with the recipients in Israel.

In a letter to The Post, Burson wrote:

"In order to clear the record further the resolution passed by the Memphis District was that

we accepted in whole the plans and programs of the Zionist Projects Fund and voted further to adopt our entire anticipated regional Zionist Project Fund quota in the amount of \$3500, of which we have already paid \$1,000.

"As part of the Zionist Project Fund each individual District is permitted to select separate or local projects towards which they desire their monies contributed to be used. The Board of Directors of the Memphis Zionist District accordingly voted to send half of their quota of \$1750 to be used as the regional or national office chose. The rest of the total of \$1750 was to be used as that part of the plan of the Zionist Projects Fund that permits a district to express its desires as to how they want the monies spent for projects in Israel. One of the first local projects adopted by the Memphis Zionist District was the sending of a deep freeze unit to Kfar Blum. As part of the Zionist Projects Fund this purchase, as all our local option projects, is to be cleared with and by the national office of the Zionist Projects Fund and is to be considered part and parcel of said Zionist Projects Fund.

### WAS NOT CONSULTED

I would like to state further that your representative in this city, Mr. Bernard Schnierer, did not consult me concerning quoting me in this article."

Meanwhile correspondent Schnierer stuck to his guns.

He said that The Post's story was accurate. The board he said voted to uphold the Zionist projects, but they "are going to do their own selecting and their own routing and there will be no controlling or attempts to control the ideologies of the recipients of their gifts.

Kfar Blum to whom Memphis will ship a quick-freeze apparatus is not a General Zionist kibbutz.

# HELLER ASKS FREEDOM OF RELIGION IN ISRAEL

WASHINGTON, D. C. (NJP)—An appeal to Israel to establish complete religious freedom and religious equality was voiced here by Rabbi James G. Heller.

"Anything else would be unworthy of Jewish history and would injure the position of Jews elsewhere," he said.

Rabbi Heller made his appeal during an address before the Washington chapter of Israel Histadrut Associates, a newly formed group affiliated with the National Committee for Labor Israel. The Cincinnati rabbi dropped his work for the Zionist Or-

ganization of America several years ago to lend his efforts to furthering the cause of Labor Zionism.

"Our historic experience has taught us that there is no substitute for religious freedom," he said. "If Israel is, after decades or perhaps centuries of development, to become a great cultural and religious center, it can not be by coercion, not by the adoption of a code or a system, however time-honored in the eyes of some, but only by enabling its people to find their own way, to try many things, to evidence their essential genius."

He pointed out it is much too early to speak of other aspects of religion in Israel today, adding that many who came to Israel came there with a prejudice against religion "in the formal sense."

"The problem is now further complicated," he explained, "by the tremendous influx of Oriental Jews, whose religion, like the life out of which they came, was of the Middle Ages. But these people already exhibit the capacity for rapid growth, for learning a new life."

"The attitude of Jews in the rest of the world should be of sympathetic understanding of these factors. We should have

## JEWISH LAW ON AGUNOT AFFIRMED; NEW KNESSET ACT MAY RELIEVE PLIGHT

JERUSALEM—Jewish women here whose husbands' deaths are reported but not clearly established, known as agunot, will not be allowed to remarry.

The Israel government in signing the International Convention on declarations of death, has affirmed the Orthodox practice.

Knesset is now considering a Declarations Of Deaths act which will regularize procedure in establishing the death of a person who has disappeared under conditions of physical danger and define regulations with regard to persons missing as a result of World War II.

During the past twenty years, the problem of the agunot has been aggravated. Orthodox law provides that widows may not remarry unless the death of their husbands could be definitely established. The death of hundreds of thousands of nameless men in Hitler's gas chambers created many agunot.

## Store Owners Ignore Request For Friday Night Closing

National Jewish Post Correspondent BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (NJP)—Downtown stores in this Southern center will remain open Friday night for the time being despite a request that merchants cease to desecrate the Sabbath.

Store owners this past week ducked a number of attempts by the Birmingham Retail Merchants Association to call a meeting to discuss the closing request.

A stymied official of the merchants group shrugged his shoulders in despair with the comment:

"Most of the boys you know, are Jewish too."

The request that the stores in the downtown area discontinue their late Friday night hours, was made by the Birmingham Protestant Ministers Association (NJP, Dec. 14, 1951).

The Protestant ministers made the request in a formal letter to the retail merchants group, a division of the city's Chamber of Commerce.

The Christian clergymen acting on a recommendation of their association's executive committee wrote:

"We are asking that all stores in the downtown shopping area be closed on Friday night so that the Jewish Sabbath will not be desecrated and Jewish employees will be permitted to attend Temple and synagogue services."

**CHRISTMAS SHOPPING**  
The request was made as the stores here resumed their annual policy of remaining open until 9 p. m., every Friday during November and December to accommodate Christmas shoppers. Rabbi Milton Grafman, the

city's only Reform rabbi, had observed that this was "playing havoc with Friday night Temple services."

The Protestant ministers then decided to request the closing on a matter of religious principle. They also pointed out that to permit the desecration of the Jewish Sabbath to go unheeded would give license to a similar violation of the Christian Sabbath.

A spokesman for the Retail Merchants Association told The Post that the letter from the Christian ministerial group had been received.

"It looks," he said, "as if the request will have to wait until we can get the group together for a meeting and that may not be until after the first of the year."

### TOO BUSY

"I have called a number of the merchants involved and they have repeatedly told me they are just too busy at this time to get together for any meeting."

The merchants association spokesman said the subject is one of the downtown store owners should be interested in as "a good portion of them are Jewish." He added that "in the clothing group, they are all Jewish."

"But," he said, "in a way you can't blame them. These few weeks before Christmas mean bread and butter to them."

He added that the late Friday night hours were only observed during November and December and that he didn't think it would lead to any year 'round policy. He didn't think either that any trend was being established that might endanger the Christian Sabbath.

### FRIDAY BUSINESS POOR

A check by The Post of the downtown stores turned up the rather startling response from most of the merchants that the late hours on Friday were far from profitable.

Said one department store operator: "Many a Friday night we never take in enough to pay the cost of our help for the extra four and one-half hours we remain open."

Said another store owner: "We'd be only too happy to remain closed Friday night, if all the stores would do the same. One store holds out and all the others become afraid he'll grab more than his share."

A check of some two-dozen of the largest stores in the downtown shopping area revealed only one that admitted the late Fridays were profitable. This store, part of a national chain, observes open nights throughout the year.

TORONTO, Canada (NJP)—Disapproval of the kashruth arrangements at the new Mount Sinai Hospital here has been expressed by the Orthodox division of the Canadian Jewish Congress.

The hospital, nearing the end of its \$1,750,000 drive to enable it to finish building, plans to maintain separate kosher facilities "for all who request them."

**DISCUSSION POSTPONED**  
The Orthodox Division's approval, registered with the Dominion Council of the Congress, will not be discussed until the hospital's current fund drive is over, probably in January.

According to J. I. Oelbaum, president of the Central Region of the Congress, the Dominion Council has decided to use its good offices to arrange a meeting at the end of the drive between a committee of the Ortho-

dox Division and the hospital's board of directors.

Ben Sadowski, chairman of the board, told The Post that experience at the old Mount Sinai hospital indicates that probably only fifty per cent of the patients will be Jewish. Of these, he said, no more than 15 to 20 per cent are likely to request kosher food.

## Pekarsky Says Allocations To Agencies Not Held Up

NEWARK (NJP)—Herman M. Pekarsky, Executive Director of the Jewish Community Council of Essex County, this week said that allocations to the national civic defense agencies are being advanced "to enable the community relations organizations to continue their operations."

"Final determination of these funds," Pekarsky told The Post, has been "postponed pending further information on the MacIver Report."

"We decided to delay final determination of specific allocations," he said, "until after the meetings of the NCRAC and the General Assembly of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, because we felt that after these two bodies had acted we would be in a better position to sit down and determine final distribution of funds to the agencies."

## Exemptions Granted From Sabbath Work Ban

JERUSALEM (MNS)—Twelve exemptions have been granted under the Work Hours Act, enabling various concerns and individuals to employ workers on the Sabbath.

Rabbi J. L. Maimon, former Minister of Religions, had participated in one of the sessions of the Ministerial Committee drawing up the exemptions and objected to some of them.

Among those granted exemptions from the ban on Sabbath work are the two electric power corporations, who will be allowed to repair breakdowns; an antibiotics laboratory which produces penicillin; a firm producing oxygen; a ship's chandler's concern which provides food for ships in port; medical institutions and homes for children and the aged and water supply works.

## Anti-Semitism Denied By Josephine Baker

NEW YORK (WNS)—Josephine Baker, Negro songstress, this week denied a recent assertion by Walter Winchell that she harbored anti-Semitic sentiments.

Declaring that the book "as a whole" shows her "happy and affectionate relations with Jews," she disclosed that she was married to a Jew, Jo Bouillon.

She added that she "always appreciated the fact that the Jewish organizations fight for equal rights for all minorities, not only for themselves."

The singer and Winchell have been snapping at each other since the mistreatment she al-

legedly received at the Stork Club, whose owner, Sherman Billingsley, is a long-time friend of Winchell.  
Her allegation set off a wave of protest in liberal circles here.

Only Dr. Morris Krugman, assistant superintendent for the New York City Bureau of Education, took vigorous exception to the principal's statement, terming it "so much nonsense."

Edwin Culbert, principal of Lincoln Junior high school in Minneapolis, had said that Jewish pupils were "ritualistic" in their approach to their studies. Citing as an example that pupils make up work missed because of Jewish holidays to as-

sure good grades rather than to master the lessons involved, he said this was due to parental stress on grades.

### 'QUEST FOR SUCCESS'

Dr. Samuel Flowerman, professor of Education at Columbia University, agreed that Jewish students generally strive for better grades, attributing this tendency to Jewish tradition and the immigrant's quest for success.

The Jewish cultural tradition emphasizes book-learning, he explained, adding that there is deep respect in the Jewish community for learned people.

The former staff member of the American Jewish Committee then observed that children of immigrant groups tend to try to achieve success in the new culture in which they live. "Ways of achieving this success are institutionalized," he said, and "schooling is one means of achieving success."

### SOCIETY PAYS OFF

He added that school authorities themselves stress good grades and that "society pays off good marks."

Dr. Flowerman asserted, however, that Culbert was "setting up a ridiculous dichotomy."

"Every educator knows that if kids really disliked their studies—got no kick out of their assignments—this lack of interest would eventually result in a deterioration of grades."

Dr. Isadore Cheln, adjunct professor of psychology at New York University, also agreed with Culbert's general assertion, but said that it had "to be taken with a grain of salt."

A major concern with grades, Dr. Cheln explained, is likely to interfere with a genuine desire for true learning. He added, however, that "it's a kind of middle class trait to be concerned about grades, and it's carried some what further by the average parent."

### SHOSHANA DAMARI SENDS AUDIENCE; ATOMIC AGE HITS CHANUKA AT LAST

BY the time Shoshana Damari retired from the stage at the Musicians Union Hall in Hollywood the other Sunday night, no-one in the audience had much noise left in his hands. They had applauded her back for one curtaincall after another, and only mutual exhaustion finally put a stop to a song recital which, for one, would have been delighted to listen to for the rest of the night.

Miss Damari's triumphant weekend in Hollywood on behalf of Israel Bonds was the doings of the Zionist Organization of America.

It brought about an advance sale of some \$30,000 worth of Israel Bonds, and perhaps one-third again that much during an appeal which was partially conducted by a rather noisy young man from the national ZOA office. The appeal had been preceded by a witty, impressive and well-rehearsed lecture by a Mr. Ralph J. Kaplan, an Israel military man and professional lecturer, who gave a number of striking examples of the growing imprint Israel's export industry is leaving upon Europe's standard of living, and pointed out that "the State of Israel was created for the future, not for the present."

Last name to be mentioned in the appeal was that of Miss Goldie Levkowitz, a lady of the theatre, who is currently holding down the post of assistant director at the Hillel Foundation of the University of Southern California.

Miss Damari, in spite of her artless appearance, and the simple, modest way she announces each of her numbers, is no child of nature on the stage, by any means, but a highly disciplined song stylist and pantomimist, whose voice is an instrument perfected down to the finest nuance.

can Jewish Congress also took exception to Culbert's generalization about Jewish students.

"There is a fundamental error involved in speaking of all members of the group as if they were alike."

He noted that "there are all kinds of Jews, all kinds of Jewish children and all kinds of Jewish parents."

Dr. Leo Srole, director of research and evaluation for the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, agreed with the Minneapolis school principal's statement, but added that "the conditions be described are not peculiar to Jewish school kids."

"The situation," Dr. Srole said, "is part of the whole emphasis on the grading system."

"My observation is that most kids are more concerned with the way their report cards look than with any real consuming interest in the subject matter."

Discounting the view that the traditional Jewish stress on learning is responsible for Jewish students' endeavor for good grades, Dr. Srole declared, "The tradition of book learning is considerably diluted."

He noted that traditional values placed upon scholarship have been very largely replaced by the contemporary values of success in the material realm."

Another demonstration of ignorance is Miss Cohen's statement in regards to the world renowned Talmudic scholar, the late Rabbi Shapiro! There we see insult and rudeness as the fruits of ignorance. It reminds me of the time before I left Australia and an Old Aborigine questioned me on my destination. I told him it was New York, a huge, tremendous city, full of skyscrapers and wonderful modern sights.

Traditional Jewish Dishes Mother Used To Prepare

I hope it won't be too unseemly to say that after noticing in the women's magazines how the food editors are wrecking their brains for new ideas for the Christmas table, all we have to remind you about at this season is to make those Chanukah potato lotkes tender and tasty.

Four variations of potato lotkes are among the suggestions of B. Manischewitz & Co. in a pamphlet sent out on Chanukah ideas:

## Our Position on Brandeis Playing on the Sabbath

**W**e have purposefully refrained from expressing an opinion on Brandeis and its problems of playing football on the Sabbath.

This is one of those explosive issues which come close to being a matter of faith. If you believe that the Torah is God given, all the arguing, logic or no logic, science or no science won't change you.

But a piece in The Valley Jewish News, (North Hollywood, Calif.) by Milt Shields, its editor, supporting the position of Brandeis seems to us to be lacking in coherence.

Shields writes:

There's another factor in this running verbal battle I'd like to tackle. That's the item of the observance of the Sabbath.

I'm appreciative of the significance of what Sabbath observance means in our religion. I know its importance and don't mean to underestimate or negate it.

But I think that Jewishness consists of more than hollow ceremony or meaningless ritual. It must be a dynamic, living, practical thing.

There's genuine Jewishness in knowing something about the culture, history and tradition of our people. Brandeis gives its students of all faiths that kind of education and orientation.

There's real Jewishness in fighting against bigotry and injustice, against oppression of the mind and body.

That's Brandeis' type of Jewishness. I'm for that.

All of the points Shields marshals have nothing at all to do with the issue.

Coach Benny Friedman's contention that unless games are played on Saturday, Brandeis

will have to abandon football is equally unwarranted.

Arnold Ginsburg, writing in The Philadelphia Jewish Times considers the matter from a traditional viewpoint and although we don't agree with him, we respect his position because he made a good case within the framework of Jewish viewpoint. His position was that the conception of a day of rest was not one of surcease from all manner of activity, and that only a slight extension of the traditional conception of the Sabbath without doing violence to the holiness of the day, would permit playing of football on the Sabbath.

There is one other point made by those who support Brandeis in its stand. That is that the school is not a Jewish seminary, but a non-sectarian institution under Jewish auspices. We are willing to accept that, although we put the contention in the class of sophistry. If Brandeis is under Jewish auspices, why shouldn't it hallow the Jew's great contribution to civilization, of a day of rest for all?

We think that Brandeis could play on Friday and do honor to the Sabbath and make a real contribution to the official Jewish view of the Sabbath as a day of rest.

Most people cannot be expected to sense the real change towards Sabbath that is slowly manifesting itself in the American Jewish community. Yet that change is substantial enough for an institution like Brandeis to give it impetus.

Eventually Brandeis will come around to this position, but why should it wait until the Sabbath gets universal acceptance in the American Jewish community? It can do itself and the Jewish religion inestimable good by making the change now as a leader instead of later on as a follower.

## Can The Will Of The Community Be Thwarted?

**I**MPORTANT insights into the developing American Jewish community are afforded by two decisions on important issues involving Jewish community life.

About eight years ago, the American Jewish Conference voted almost unanimously to uphold the Biltmore program, which urged the formation of a Jewish state.

This month the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds acted on the MacIver Report, which will bring coordination into the highly-competitive field of Jewish civic defense work.

Whether the American Jewish Conference had made the decision or not; and whether the CJFWF had voted to uphold the MacIver Report or not, is not the important consideration.

The important point is that the community had made up its mind on both issues, and all that possibly could have been done to either decision by the opposition would have been to delay them.

The lesson for the Jewish community here is that even though there was no *modus vivendi* for registering community decision in American Jewish life as we have in governments with their elected delegates and legislative bodies, once the community had reached a decision, a way was bound to be found to register that decision.

The late Henry Monsky and Judge Proskauer were able in 1944 to forestall effective coordination in the civic defense work for seven years. But eventually community wishes in this important area of work made themselves felt. If there had not been a MacIver Report, some other way would have had to be found, and would have been found.

In the case of Zionism and Israel, the lesson is even clearer. The American Jewish Committee withdrew from the American Jewish Conference because the Conference decided to vote on the question of the Biltmore program.

Yet whether the Conference had or had not voted on the issue (the AJC Committee had been promised that the matter would not be brought up for decision) would have made no difference, except perhaps in time. The Jewish community of the U.S. was solidly behind any legitimate effort to insure a Jewish-controlled state in Palestine.

If there were an American Jewish Conference, the decision on vital issues would be made in more orderly fashion, and they would have been reached more promptly.

But even without such an agency, the will of the community cannot be thwarted successfully for long, and those agencies who find themselves resisting that will, sooner or later lose their popular support.

## Our Conception Of A Rabbi

**W**E LIKE Arnold Ginsburg's words on the passing of Rabbi C. David Matt. For us, the piece could well be titled, the passing of a rabbi, for Ginsburg's expressions in his weekly column in The Philadelphia Jewish Times, encompass what most of us would subscribe to as an ideal rabbi.

"Rabbi Matt possessed, however, a beautiful soul and a sensitive spirit. He had a spiritual fineness that made his personality radiant. He was friendly, he was warm. Notwithstanding various hardships, he had a cheerful disposition and a sweet smile . . .

"He was a deeply religious man and a learned Hebrew scholar. He was a graduate and devoted supporter of Gratz College, oldest school in America for training teachers of Judaism. All his children

are Gratz College alumni and one is a rabbi. Last year, Rabbi Matt was named the outstanding alumnus of Gratz College by its Alumni Association. He participated actively in many fields of Jewish communal endeavor, including Zionism.

"Whatever he did, Rabbi Matt did in a quiet way. Too often those who lead a quiet but useful life are appreciated most after they are gone. The many persons whom Rabbi Matt befriended during his life and the many who had the privilege of knowing him and his unusually fine qualities mourn the passing of this righteous man of God.

"A good rabbi has died. His memory is a blessing for all of us."

## You Answer That One!

**I**F THERE is such a thing as Jewish shame, take the situation in Birmingham, Ala. There the Protestant Ministers Association has initiated a campaign against Friday night opening of stores.

Who own the majority of the stores?

Jews.

Why are the Protestant ministers protesting?

Because Rabbi Milton Grafman, spiritual leader of many of these self-same store owners asked the ministers to raise their voice against Friday-night store opening.

Why didn't the rabbi, together with the rabbis of the city's other two congregations, go to the Jewish store-owners and secure their cooperation against Friday-night opening?

You answer that one!

## THE EDITOR'S CHAIR

**I** HAVE the following from Irving Edison, who is president of the National Jewish Welfare Board, which I am glad to pass on. I have only this comment. During World War II, the needs of the Jewish Welfare Board were so well met, that after hostilities, the JWB showed a balance, and was able therefore to cut its financial requirements for the following year.

Why the situation should be different now is difficult to understand. A sidelight on the attitude of the Jewish community's disinterest in her Jewish service people today may be seen from my own experience.

When my nephew was sent to Fort — Ga., I wrote him to look up a friend, who is a leading Southern Zionist, and also the nearby rabbi, both of whom I felt sure would be glad to extend traditional Jewish hospitality. He did so, and even on Yom Kippur night was not invited to break his fast with my friend, who didn't even invite him to services when he came to the synagogue. As for the rabbi, he was just as negligent.

All our welfare funds before they make even the first penny of allocations, take care of local needs, such as salaries, local Jewish centers, and so forth. This providing for the needs of our men in the armed services is a local need just as much as is the salary of the federation director, no less. Your son away from home is still your son, and your annual contribution to your local drive is your provision for your son, even if he is in a distant community.

Edison writes:

"Four million men in uniform cannot alone defend this country. It requires the participation of each and every one of us, each and every community, each and every branch of the service.

"One agency in American Jewish life has been consistently meeting with branches of the Department of Defense with reference to answering the morale needs of these times. One agency in American Jewish life has the responsibility for procuring, qualifying and servicing Jewish chaplains that are administering to our own boys and girls.

"This one agency is the National Jewish Welfare Board. Historically it is their job. The unmet needs in this area of service are most unfortunate and do not accurately reflect the hearts of American Jews.

"Allocation committees have not readjusted their appropriations to the changed conditions of the lives of so many of our young people. Apathy prevails. Excuses are given as an accommodation to only token increases.

"One hour with one chaplain would convince every budget committee of the urgency for more participation in the changed situation to which all American living is rapidly adjusting. Some community budget committees are behind the times as well as behind in their fund raising goals."

**K**NOWING The Post's rule against accepting advertising offering non-kosher products for sale, Charles W. Morris, of Louisville, clipped from our Kentucky paper an advertisement from a sausage-maker, and sent it on to me.

Charles offered no comment except to scribble in red pencil, the very expressive, "Oy."

We wonder where Charles learned yiddish so quickly.

But what I wanted to tell you was that Charles, a Jewish leader with whom I often disagree,

but always admire, suffered a slight heart attack. He is resting well and should be back in action soon, perhaps even before you read this.

**I**N my editor's chair of Dec. 7 I described the case of Rabbi Harold Englander of Kingston who vacated his pulpit when his congregation repudiated his stand against bringing Christmas celebrations into the public schools. My aphasia was working overtime—I called him Rabbi Greenberg.

Rabbi Englander left Kingston and put his career in the rabbinate behind him. He went to Israel where as Zvi Englander he became a successful Israeli industrialist. Incidentally, he is now in the U.S. on a tour for the Israel bond drive.

I have a note from another rabbi asking if it wasn't the Jewish Institute of Religion under the presidency of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise which forbade any of its graduates to accept the vacated Kingston pulpit. That may be so, but it was the Rabbinic Assembly of America, the Conservative rabbinical organization, which issued the ban on its members from filling the vacant pulpit for a period of time. If other seminaries or rabbinical bodies took like action, we didn't hear about it.

## Artukovich Attorney Retracts Statement on Jews

**L**OS ANGELES (NJP)—During a discussion period following an open forum on the Artukovich case at the Beverly-Fairfax Jewish Community Center here, the attorney for the alleged Croatian mass murderer warned Jews that, "if you don't watch out, you will incur the wrath of the Catholic Church."

The remark was occasioned by a question from a girl in the audience whether Artukovich was being supported by the Catholic Church.

When the chairman of the meeting pointed out that the girl, a survivor from Croatia, was non-Jewish, Artukovich's attorney apologized and denied any anti-Semitic sentiments.

They argued that allowing Artukovich to be extradited by the Yugoslavian government to be tried for war crime charges would help to strengthen Communism.

**Rabbi Holds To Views on Xmas in Schools, Flays Leadership**

● Editor, National Jewish Post:

Thank you for your column about the incident in Waterbury surrounding a sermon I preached on the unlawful use of Christmas teachings in the public schools for sectarian instruction.

I am happy that you ignored your correspondents' request to shush up the matter. I can understand why many Jews in Waterbury do not wish the Jewish world to know about the incident because the leaders of this community acted in an ignoble manner. They issued a statement which said that my views "did not represent the views of

the Jewish community."

This is false . . . My views were statements of facts more than personal opinion that no one could dispute. Most of the Jews in city agreed with those facts. But our so-called Jewish leaders disassociated themselves from truth and repudiated a rabbi in order to placate their Christian customers and "friends."

Your column said that I signed that statement. I did not. I would not take back a word of what I said nor repudiate any part of it by signing such a state-

ment. I tried to get the Community Relations Committee of the Community Council to be accurate, truthful and honorable about their statement, but they rejected every statement. They were panicked and unreasonable. I quit the meeting ashamed, angry and disgusted.

After the statement was passed the newspaper informed the Committee that it would not publish any more material on the subject after Friday, the day after Thanksgiving and nothing would be published on Thanksgiving. This was the day before

Thanksgiving. Since the statement was designed to stop the newspaper from publishing any more inflammatory letters-to-the-editor, it was no longer necessary to have any statement from the Jewish community at all. Nevertheless, a subcommittee of four took it to the newspaper on Friday morning and had it published. Many of those who voted for it on Wednesday had already changed their minds by Friday, but they had no opportunity to reconsider.

It should be said for the record that the Board of my Congrega-

tion withstood community pressure and affirmed the freedom of their rabbi to speak his mind from their pulpit and to conduct Jewish-Christian relations in accordance with his own views.

The Jewish community of Waterbury was victimized by a group of panicked men who do not know what it means to defend Jewish interests. It costs to be a Jew. Those unwilling to pay the price have no right to lead the Jewish people.

**SALKIN CLAIMS POSITION MISSTATED ON FRIDAY NIGHT STORE OPENINGS**

My attention was called to an article which appeared in your POST on Nov. 30th pertaining to the opening of the retail stores on Friday nights in Aberdeen, S. Dakota. This article may give your readers a distorted picture of what actually transpired, because the letter I mailed to Rabbi Auerbach was not published in its entirety.

It is difficult to distinguish true facts by reading excerpts from a private letter published with captions which are biased. The captions of the article convey the impression that we resisted the closing of the stores on Friday night. The fact of the matter is that we had very little to do with the opening of the stores on Friday night. Since four of the larger stores, namely Sears, Ward, Penney and Gamble-Skogmo decided to stay open without discussing it with us, we had no choice in the matter.

According to information we received, Rabbi Auerbach himself created a situation which caused resistance to the closing on Friday night. He did not use the good judgement expected of a man in his position. The second paragraph of the article will verify this. It reads as follows:

"When four large stores announced Friday night opening recently, Rabbi Selig S. Auer-

bach immediately began a campaign to secure adherence to an old Chamber of Commerce decision not to keep open at night.

This is Rabbi Auerbach's own statement.

It is obvious why the Managers of the larger stores would not cooperate with him. Perhaps we could have influenced the managers of the other chain stores to keep the stores open some other night instead of Friday. But since the religious aspect was involved, and the campaign of Rabbi Auerbach, advocating not to open the stores on any night, it would have been futile for us to intervene.

I am fully aware of the recent movement by all the rabbis to revitalize the observance of the Sabbath. I also appreciate the significance a Rabbi attaches to Friday night services. It will require a long process of re-educating the people who drifted away from the houses of worship, and its eventual progress will depend a great deal on the intelligence of our religious leaders in their respective communities. I am firmly convinced that expediency will not accomplish the expected results.

**DIGEST OF YIDDISH PRESS  
GOLDEN AGE OF LITHUANIAN JEWS  
EXCEEDED THAT OF SPAIN—GINZBERG**

A monument to Lithuanian Judaism has appeared in the form of a gigantic volume (2007 pages) to which 117 writers have contributed. A preface by Dr. Louis Ginzberg, of the Jewish Theological Seminary probably the world's most learned Litvak, bemoans the disappearance of one of Jewry's richest sectors and salutes the achievements of the Lithuanian epoch, a Golden Age surpassing that of Spain itself in

glitter and in glory. In his review, Dr. A. birthday amidst kudos and eclat from his admirers. And more recently a new collection of his verse has appeared. The book contains 800 poems, but is only a fraction of the total output of one of Israel's sweetest singers. (L. Fogleman, The Forward).

**J.W.V. Not Militaristic Body, A Defense Agency, Says Head**  
THE National Jewish War Veterans of America will acquire extra vigor since acquiring its new president, Paul Ginzberg, according to S. Secular, of The American, who interviewed Ginzberg and came away greatly impressed. The new commander volunteered for the U. S. Army in World War II, served in the Pacific theater and was decorated.

What especially enchants Secular about Ginzberg is that the latter is an Orthodox Jew (a leader of Atlanta's Ahavat Achim congregation), knows and likes Yiddish, and is, in general, a "haimisher mensch." Tell your readers, Ginzberg urged, that the JWV is not a militaristic outfit. **I THINK AS I PLEASE  
U. S. JEWS SHOULD ACCEPT FACTS  
OF LIFE IN CHRISTIAN COUNTRY**

THIS YEAR has been no exception with its usual crop of news stories about Christmas "incidents" and the Jewish problem.

My files contain a fat folder of clippings going back two decades, and the story is almost monotonous in its annual repetition by now: protest by some Jews against Christmas observance in the public schools; counter-protest by Christians to the effect that Jews are trying to take Christ out of Christmas; additional counter-protest from other Jews who repudiate the initial protestors; pathetic efforts by some to introduce Chanukah into the school as a protective device—and accompanying all the stories, the plaintive inquiries from parents who want to know how to offset the Christmas influence on their children.

SOME YEARS ago I might have been among those battling valiantly to keep religion out of the public schools, ready to face the devil himself in defense of the principle that church and state must be kept separate. I have no doubt that the occasional rabbis and other individual Jewish leaders who carry on the good fight are sincere, courageous advocates of these principles. But I have since come to the conclusion that they are butting their heads against a stone wall, and that the Jewish masses who repudiate them have the sounder instinct.

The immediate motives of those who refuse to endorse the courageous rabbi may not be lofty; indeed, quite the reverse, they may be based on fawning, cringing desire to retain Gentle "good will"; on fear of antagonizing their customers, irrespective of any principals involved—but I repeat, their instincts are sound, for they realize without the need of logical exposition or philosophic theorizing that they are a minority in a country predominantly Christian.

No matter what the United States Constitution may say, Christmas, the religious festival of the Christians, has become a part of the national culture of America. No amount of effort will ever succeed in extirpating it from the schools or in minimizing its overpowering influence on daily life in the weeks immediately precedent. So long as Jews try to fight the Christmas observance, they are doomed to failure and to inevitable exacerbation of relationship with their neighbors. When Jews reconcile themselves to the true state of affairs, and recognize that this is a Christian country, they will better be able to defend their children from the psychological ill-effects of this season.

THE ANSWER does not lie in dressing up Chanukah with Yule tapertences and telling the children that it is the Jewish Christmas. Jewish life and Judaism will never appeal to our people if offered only as an anemic imitator of Christianity.

The answer lies in a system of Jewish education, for young and adults alike, which will help to develop an understanding and awareness of the merits of Judaism—and of the values of the Jewish holidays in their own identity. The principle involved in the Christmas-Chanukah conflict, then, is the same principle which must govern the philosophy of Jewish life in America.

The parent who complains that his child has fallen under the Christmas influence thereby confesses that his child is receiving an inadequate Jewish education. As well deny to the child all the protections of vaccinations and inoculations developed by science, and then complain bitterly that for some reason the youngster is constantly becoming ill.

CHILDREN who attend all-day Jewish schools are never disturbed by the Santa Claus, Christmas tree and tinsel atmosphere because they have no psychological void to be filled. Nor is their problem solved only because they have withdrawn from relationship with non-Jew in the school system; surely they have numerous other exposures to the seasonal influence.

Likewise it is possible for Jewish children who do go to public schools to be impervious to the undermining Christmas effect if they receive a supplemental Jewish education of merit, or if they are fortified with an understanding based on a good Jewish home life.

The solution to the Christmas problem, then, lies not in trying to change the habits and accepted procedures of the Christian majority, but in strengthening the consciousness and dignity and sense of values of the Jewish minority.

# ISRAEL

## END OF ZOA SEEN IN TIE TO GENERAL ZIONIST PARTY

By M. Z. FRANK

I RECEIVED a letter from the editor of The National Jewish Post, asking me to comment on several problems, which I am going to take up one by one, in each of the succeeding columns, before discussing anything else.

"Jacques Torczyner and Emanuel Neumann . . . hope to reaffirm the ZOA resolution affiliating the organization with the General Zionist party in Israel" . . . etc.

Comment: They may get their resolution, and even the control of the ZOA machinery, but there won't be any Zionist Organization worth controlling.

They've been at it for several years. And now, look at the ZOA!

I hope Emanuel Neumann does a better job at the Economic Department of the Jewish Agency than at the ZOA. I have watched Neumann do great things for which he deserves a place of honor in the hearts of the Jewish people. I have also watched him destroy, with blind fury, the precious instruments which he himself helped make great.

Neumann is here now, he came practically the same day that Henry Morgenthau left. There is a connection between the two visits, and Neumann himself pointed it out. He said that both the sale of bonds and private investments form part of the program adopted at the King David Hotel Conference over a year ago.

The former has already been launched; the latter is beginning to emerge from the preliminary stages of groping and bungling. Let us hope that the steadily improving machinery of the government institutions in Israel and Neumann's guidance will bring the matter of economic investments up to the same level as the Bond Drive.

★ ★ ★

**N**OW, A few words about the Bond Drive.

Despite all the faults which one may justly point out in the workings of the Israel government, it is a real government in a real state, really responsible to a real population which is really interested in the way its fortunes are being decided and it taxes spent. The Zionist Organization out of which the State of Israel emerged, was, in a sense, a make-believe state, with a make-believe citizenry, a make-believe population and a make-believe interest.

Money paid out for a bond will have to be reimbursed to the purchaser—plus interest—by the Israel Treasury, that is, eventually, by the Israel taxpayer. If the money is not paid back, the country's credit will suffer and that, in turn, affects the individual taxpayer.

Thus, the citizen of Israel has a direct interest in, and a direct control of, the expenditure of the bond drive money. He will call his government to account; the government will fear an upset in the next elections; the government must take into account the mood of public opinion in the country. Furthermore, money which has to be paid back, is more likely to be used in a businesslike fashion than gift money.

**T**HE MONEY collected by the United Jewish Appeal is badly needed: it goes for expenses from which no return can be expected. But that is an emergency which must not be prolonged beyond a reasonably necessary period.

It is difficult to find the persons or the institutions to which the authorities administering the expenditures are responsible. The taxpayer in Israel has no claim on controlling that money, because it does not come out of his pocket. The giver in New York or Milwaukee is not represented in the administration in the same way that the taxpayer in Israel is represented in the Knesset. Who controls the expenditure of the UJA? The Jewish Agency? To whom is it responsible? To the Zionist Congress—but it meets once in four years and consists of delegates who are not versed in the problems.

This is not just theory. Any observer will tell you that the Israel Government shows a keener sense of responsibility for the money it spends than the Jewish Agency. The Government would never have dared to treat the Report of the Government Comptroller in the same way as the Agency is treating the Shmorack Report. The Israel Government has a real boss—and the boss is the guy in Israel who pays the taxes.

**T**HE MORE money is invested in the Bond Drive and in private enterprises, the more of a businesslike atmosphere will be introduced into the management of money in Israel—which, in turn, is bound to affect the management of money by the Jewish Agency and other bodies administering gift money.

The fact of the matter is that the public is ripping mad about the Shamrock Report, but all it can exert is moral pressure. Legally, the local public can do nothing to the Agency, and nobody else can until the next Congress.

The more the public gets used to efficient administration of money by private companies (such as the Palestine Economic

Corporation), and the Bond Drive monies by the Government, the stronger its moral pressure will be exerted on the Jewish Agency.

I AM in no position to judge the results of the Bond Drive in America. But I don't think the exaggerated and premature dirges are in place. For forty years the Jewish public has been educated to the idea that Israel is charity. It is not so easy to re-educate them to the idea that Israel is a going concern and that financial investments in Israel can bring returns. It ought not to surprise anybody if the transformation is accompanied by jolts and shocks. But if we stick by it, we shall get there.

### ONE TERM IN ISRAEL

JERUSALEM—Knesset has recently unanimously approved a bill limiting the tenure of presidents of Israel to one five-year term.

Under the new bill, the president is elected by the Knesset on only a simple majority of fifty-one percent. The president's term of office can be terminated

within the five year period only if he resigns, or is suspended.

## Rabbinical Body Issues Ultimatum To Hospital In Kashruth Tiff

NEW YORK (NJP)—The newly formed Rabbis' committee for Kashruth in the Long Island Jewish Hospital has sent hospital trustees a letter demanding kashruth, with an ultimatum that a reply be received no later than Feb. 1. The ultimatum was backed with a threat of a possible break in relations between Long Island rabbis and the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies, which is supporting the proposed institution.

"In view of the fact that previous representations by leading members of the Long Island rabbinate have been repeatedly ignored," the communication said, "with an opportunity being offered them to present their point of view before the Board of Trustees of the Institution, we urge members of this governing body to give immediate and serious attention to our urgent plea that the hospital be established unequivocally as kosher, and request a reply to this communication no later than February 1.

### IMPLIED THREAT

"Otherwise, we shall be forced to reconsider the long-standing policy of cooperation between the Long Island rabbinate and Federation with its constituent agencies, and to initiate an active educational campaign on the issues involved both locally and throughout the city."

Meanwhile, Rabbi I. Usher Kirshblum, committee chairman, told The Post that Federation's fund-raising campaign is suffering greatly as a result of the hospital controversy.

"I know for a fact that the results of Federation dinners on Long Island have not been good," he said. "They are not being as well attended as last year."

He said that at one Federation fund-raising meeting in Jamaica, about 15 orthodox congregation members were deliberately ignored when names were being called for contribution because it was known that they would donate only on condition that the Long Island Jewish hospital be kosher.

### PLANS MASS MEETING

The committee's statement revealed that as a first step in acquainting the public with the issues involved a Long Island wide conference on "Jewish Philanthropy and Its Responsibility to the Jewish Community" would be held.

The committee declared that the so-called compromise plan offered by hospital trustees to give the project both kosher and non-kosher facilities would result in "squandering of public funds."

Reiterating its rejection of the compromise plan, the committee said kashruth was "not a matter of negotiation where concessions from both sides are to be expected. It is an issue involving the unity of the Jewish community and the respect which it owes to the character and spirit of Jewish tradition."

The statement was signed by Rabbi Kirshblum, Rabbi Robert Gordis, chairman of the group's executive committee, and Rabbi Gilbert Klapperman, secretary. Rabbi Kirshblum later told The Post he "cannot believe that Federation is unable to take a

NEW YORK (NJP)—Rabbi Robert Gordis, a member of the executive council of the Rabbinical Assembly of America (Conservative), revealed to The Post this week that he recently became a member of Hapoel Hamizrachi, an Orthodox Labor-Zionist organization.



According to the Conservative leader, Hapoel Hamizrachi "represents the most hopeful group in Israel. It represents a synthesis of religious tradition and social progress in a context of constructive labor."

A spokesman for Hapoel Hamizrachi told The Post that "membership is open to all men and women of the Jewish faith who believe in Torah Va'Avodah (Torah and Labor)."

A former chairman of the education committee of the Zionist Organization of America, Rabbi Gordis said he is continuing his affiliation with the ZOA. At present he is on the executive board of the ZOA district of Rockaway Park, N. Y. ZOA president Benjamin G. Browdy had no comment.

## Agency Says It'll Push Brandeis Hoopsters Ban On Food Drives Score Two Victories

NEW YORK (NJP)—The Jewish Agency "will make every effort" to implement its policy of discouraging food campaigns in this country for Israel, an Agency spokesman told The Post this week.

The Zionist Organization of America is continuing its food campaign despite a recent Agency statement that such campaigns tend to divert public support from such major fund-raising efforts in behalf of the Jewish State as the United Jewish Appeal and the bond drive. A ZOA spokesman last week told The Post that there is no conflict between its food campaign and the major drives, adding that the Israel Government gave the ZOA a food import license.

The Agency food policy was arrived at in consultation with Israel authorities.

Dr. Sidney Marks, executive director of the ZOA left this week by plane on a special mission to Israel to complete arrangements for the implementation of the recently adopted ZOA Israel projects program.

**Even Baby Will Be Looking For 'Kosher' Label On Food**

SEVEN ARTS—Jewish mothers whose determination to keep a kosher cuisine extends to the baby's menu—a resolve which has substantially increased their hours spent over the traditional hot stove—can look forward soon to finding kosher canned meats for their young ones at the local grocery store.

That assurance comes from Saul Bernstein, administrator of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, who reports that negotiations are now underway which promise early success in making possible that time- and temper-saving boon.

Just exactly how soon, Bernstein is unable to say, but he reported that, after several vigorous but unsuccessful attempts, the (Continued on next page)

Union's division of kashrut believes it has located the right packer and the right conditions, and is pushing for a productive merger.

The efforts of the Union to add that food line to the list of products bearing the "U" label—now more than 300 produced by more than 90 companies—has followed the pattern developed in the kashrut division's 27 years of experience. The prospective buyers indicate by letters and telephone calls to the UOJC office and to rabbis associated with the UOJC that a demand exists. The division thereupon swings into action to provide the supply.

Bernstein emphasizes that the companies come to the UOJC, not the other way. "We have no outside representatives," he says.

Currently the demand is rising steadily for kosher margarine and kosher sweet cookies. Two brands of margarine will soon be under the UOJC's supervision, and a famous line of sweet cookies will shortly be marketed with the "U" label.

One fact that has been clearly demonstrated is that substantial portions of the American Jewish market cannot be tapped without kosher products. Bernstein cited the case of detergents.

"Every major manufacturer in the field has come to us for endorsement of his detergent," he said. "There is now such a deter-

gent on the list of each firm. The companies found that Jewish housewives insisted on kosher detergents."

The administrator cited two unique phases of the program. One is that there is no difference. (Continued on next page)

dial in price between foods with  
the "U" label and the same food  
product without it, a happy con-  
dition which does not generally  
exist for the kashrut-minded  
housewife.

"Most of the participating com-  
panies figure in our fees for su-  
pervision as part of their promo-  
tion and advertising costs," Bern-  
stein explained. "On a unit basis,  
the additional costs of our super-  
vision is fractional, and the  
housewife need pay no premium  
for these kosher products."

An equally pleasant revelation  
is that the kashrut program is,  
through its fees, self-supporting,  
a fairly rare phenomenon in Jew-  
ish life. Bernstein said that at  
first the UOJC subsidized the pro-  
gram. As it expanded, the outlay  
became a steadily heavier burden.  
Eventually the kashrut division

worked out a fee system large enough to cover the costs of the program and small enough to assure that prices would not be higher to the Jewish purchaser.

In addition to a small office staff and Bernstein, the program is operated by Rabbi Alexander Rosenberg as rabbinic administrator. About 100 rabbis act as rabbinic representatives in supervising the participant companies.

What does all of this prove about dietary observances among American Jews? Bernstein replies that it does demonstrate a

growing market for kosher products. While comprehensive figures are not available, the kashrut division has clear evidence that when a well-known product is made available with the "U" label, its sales promptly mount.

Generalizations about American Jews and religious observances are risky, and Bernstein hesitates to speculate on the wider meaning of the success of the kashrut program.

"Over the last half-century, the tendency among American Jews has been away from religious observance," he says. "I like to feel that the tendency is now in the other direction."

But he is fully aware of the inconsistencies which mark the behavior and attitudes of American Jews about such matters.

"Many Jews who are unobservant and who do not hesitate to eat non-kosher foods nevertheless show a marked preference, particularly in their homes, for kosher foods," he notes.

the kind of approaches they make which tend to destroy the very good will they now enjoy."

The Jewish Spectator went so far as to print ads from these firms on pages marked and numbered, to give the impression of a closed deal, and then sent this ad, with a bill, to the advertisers on their "sucker" list.

The Indianapolis JCRC has notified the local Better Business Bureau and has been in touch with the postal authorities since it learned about the first of these letters, last fall.

This practice by these papers has caused resentment among local firms against their methods; and the fact that Jewish newspapers are conducting this campaign casts reflections upon Jewish businessmen in the eyes of non-Jewish merchants, on the one hand; and upon the legitimate operations of all Jewish newspapers in the eyes of merchants both Jewish and non-Jewish.

Businessmen are advised that bills only from ads solicited and approved in advance, by representatives of bona fide newspapers in their trade areas, should be accorded their compliance.
